



DAVID BROWNLEE AV AND EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS



SOUND

Lavaliere microphone – wireless

Handheld, wireless microphone or handheld microphone with a long (at least 50-foot) cord. It is preferred that this is not the same microphone that the introducer will be using.

Sufficient speaker system facing the audience



STAGING

A riser/stage approximately 8'x12' or larger. David works center stage without a lectern. If a lectern is being used for other presentations, please position it at least four feet from the front edge of the "stage." David will work in front of the lectern.



ACCESSORIES

Screen for David's PowerPoint Presentation (projector, TV's or Monitors)

If using David's laptop, need long HDMI cable.

If no DJ or Sound Tech, please advise as David plays music and video during his presentation. Depending on the type of program, David may use a flip chart. He will inform you if that is necessary.

Confidence monitor for David to view "presenter mode" of his presentation (if applicable)

Sound monitors on stage if large crowd – 500 people or more



LIGHTING

Lighting is important. Please make sure David has a well-lit “performance area.” Full house lights and spotlight if necessary.

Most meeting rooms are fine, but when David does after-dinner programs the lights must be full and bright.

(David’s programs are not intended for low light /romantic settings)



BOOK SIGNING TABLE

A small table at the back of the room or in the hallway for David to sign guest copies of his books and take selfies with the audience, round cocktail table or dressed, 4-6 ft table is just perfect.



VIDEO

David travels with a cameraman to capture David’s keynotes.

PHOTO

David travels with a photographer to capture David’s keynotes.
